REIMS MOUNTAIN REGIONAL NATURE PARK

Dominating Greater Reims, Reims Mountain offers a mosaic of environments that shelter a surprising diversity of fauna and flora, the finest of which are the "Faux de Verzy", a variety of dwarf beech trees. The landscapes, steeped in history, are characterised by a trilogy of forests-grapevines-crops, which provides this territory with its singular identity.

From the Maison du Parc information centre to sites with a panoramic view of the Marne Valley and Reims Mountain and from the Romanesque churches of Tardenois to the Faux de Verzy, by way of the discovery trail of Mailly-Champagne or the trail leading past the stone huts in the vineyards, along the hiking and mountain-biking trails..., the Regional Nature Park truly cultivates the art of diversity.

Reception at the Maison du Parc in Pourcy, every day from 1.30 pm to 5.30 pm, April to October (Monday to Friday from November to March). Permanent exhibition, conservatory orchard, picnic areas... Free admission.

NOTRE-DAME CATHEDRAL

1

Notre-Dame de Reims is one of Europe's most important Gothic structures. This masterpiece of the 13th century, as the coronation cathedral for 25 kings, boasts an abundant statuary and exceptional stained-glass windows (among which glittering contemporary works by Chagall and by Kneebel).

PALACE OF TAU

The former palace of the archbishops of Reims was also the residence of the Kings of France during their coronation. Transformed in the late 17th c., the Palace of Tau houses the treasury of Notre-Dame, among which remarkable objects associated with the coronations together with spectacular sculptures and statues.

Open 9.30am-6.30pm from 06-05 to 08-09; 9.30am-12.30pm and 2pm-5.30pm from 09-09 to 05-05. Closed Mondays and 01-01, 01-05, 01-11, 11-11 and 25-12.

CARNEGIE LIBRARY - ART DECO

Reims offers a panorama of the principal trends in architecture during the 1920s in France. The main one among them, Art déco, tries to be both geometrical and decorative. Among the iconic buildings on your way may be cited the Carnegie Library, a jewel of Art Deco architecture, and Cours Jean-Baptiste Langlet, which provides a very varied range of styles from the inter-war period.

GALLO-ROMAN CRYPTOPORTICUS

Built circa 100 A.D., these three partially buried galleries located beneath the Gallo-Roman forum of Durocortorum may have once been a covered market. Only the eastern gallery has remained, but it is among the few cryptoporticus of the Roman world to have been excavated. Temporary exhibitions.

HOTEL SAINT-JEAN-BAPTISTE DE LA SALLE

An exhibition presents the history of the Institute of the Brothers of Christian Schools and its founder, Jean-Baptiste de La Salle, who was born here in 1651. Construction of the Hôtel de La Salle began in 1545. The building features various decorative motifs in keeping with the tastes of the Renaissance.

LE VERGEUR MUSEUM-HOTEL

The home of the traveller and philanthropist Hugues Krafft, left untouched after his death in 1935, houses 2,400 decorative art objects (furniture, paintings, prints and objects brought back from the Orient). Wood engravings by Dürer and the beautiful interior Renaissance-style façade complete the tour.

BOULINGRIN COVERED MARKET

The Halles du Boulingrin are a model of modern architecture and structure, with the latest construction materials and techniques; an emblematic building of the period between the wars, they were meticulously restored and re-opened in 2012. The building hosts the city-centre market on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday mornings as well as a special market for organic products on Fridays from 4 pm to 8 pm.

MARS GATE

This symbolic entrance to the ancient Roman city of Durocortorum is today the largest remaining archway of the Roman Empire. The Mars Gate is the main testimony of the prosperity of a city that was once the capital of the imperial province of Gallia Belgica and one of the great cities of Roman Gaul.

Under refurbishment, Mars Gate is no longer visible until the end of 2017.

The Museum of Fine Arts has one of the most prestigious museum collections in France. It illustrates the major artistic movements from the 16th to the 21st century through paintings, sculptures, furniture and objects d'art.

SAINT-REMI BASILICA

10

This Romanesque-Gothic abbey church is impressive because of its profundity and its sober majesty. It was built from the 11th century onwards in order to house the Holy Ampulla and the remains of Saint Remi, the bishop who baptized Clovis in 498. Its Renaissance-styled tomb dates from the 19th century.

SAINT-REMI HISTORY MUSEUM

The museum occupies a former Benedictine abbey dating from the 17th and 18th centuries. The 17 rooms surrounding the cloister house important collections dedicated to local history, from prehistoric times to the Renaissance, to regional military history and more.

The Regional Collections of Modern Art (FRAC) has as its aim the building-up and diffusion of a collection of modern works of art, the programming and realization of temporary exhibitions and the organization of events to increase awareness of modern art for the widest possible audience.

From the Marne taxi to the racing car, you will discover the development of the automobile in the 20th century. Nearly 230 vehicles, certain models having been manufactured in limited editions, are exhibited in what is one of the most important car museums in France.

FOUJITA CHAPEL

After his conversion to Catholicism, the French-Japanese painter Leonard Foujita designed this Neo-Romanesque chapel in 1966. The iconographical programme of the stained-glass windows and of the 200 m² large fresco is inspired by the Christ's life, but also partly by the Japanese tradition.

MUSEUM OF THE SURRENDER 7 MAY 1945

The unconditional surrender of the German army was signed in a room of General Eisenhower's headquarters on 7 May 1945. This room is still intact today and a museum has been created in 2005 in order to allow visitors to follow the major developments of World War II.

PLANETARIUM

16

The planetarium uses its dome as a screen to reproduce the starry sky using a set of screening devices. Visitors can gain many insights into the stars from the plentiful information provided on the subject of astronomy.

This fort was built in 1883 to defend Reims. Today a museum, it houses rich collections of military uniforms, weapons, canons and hats (among which the famous Friese collection of the Imperial German army).
